Recycling Made Easy



Why are the recyclables all put in together and not sorted at the source? Approximately 95% of our residents are recycling regularly and with those quantities and the range of materials that are being picked up, it would be impossible to provide a truck with that many compartments! It is quite cost-effective to sort at the depot (see below)



Why isn't glass accepted for recycling? Although 'container' glass, such as food jars and bottles can physically be recycled, 'plate' or 'flat' glass can't be because of its chemical composition. At this time, we aren't accepting container glass as the costs to transport and process are so high. Most glass still being accepted at other depots is being processed and used as road crush and fill in landfills.



Can waxed or treated cardboard like milk cartons be recycled? Paper and cardboard that is coated or heavily inked cannot be recycled because they can't be 'pulped'

YES these materials are recyclables

- Newsprint (includes clean newspapers, flyers, magazines, and catalogues)
- Cardboard and boxboard (remove liners and flatten)
- Mixed Paper like envelopes,

office papers, copy paper, but excludes "brights" paper

- Metal food and beverage containers like cans, aluminum foil and trays
- Plastic household food and beverage containers like milk jugs, margarine and yogurt containers, plastic bottles and jars
- Plastic containers from household cleaners like dishwashing detergent, laundry soap and softeners, (but not bleach!) and cleaners that don't require special handling
- Rinse to remove food residue, remove lids, and flatten or stack (yogurt containers for example) where possible

No these materials are not recyclables

- Glass. Dispose of at the CVRD recycling depots or in regular garbage
- Styrofoam includes egg cartons, meat, and meal packaging

- Waxed or Soiled Boxes like milk cartons, drink boxes (most of these can be returned for deposit), pizza boxes, paper take-out containers
- Books (soft or hardcover and telephone books)
- Plastic containers used for chlorine and ammonia cleaners, motor oil or antifreeze containers, spray nozzle heads, bottle caps, and lids
- Plastic bags, wrap and film
- Paint and paint products like thinners, Varsol, etc
- Aerosol cans of any type, Batteries, Light Bulbs, Construction or Demolition materials, animal feces, diapers, and Yard and kitchen waste (organics)

The following restrictions will apply to the Yard Waste pickup:

- Yard waste must be in a container, except tree/hedge branches (see below). Please mark the can/container with the words YARD WASTE.
- Yard Waste in any kind of bag will NOT be picked up as these bags have to be opened to be dumped.
- Tree and hedge/shrub prunings and branches do not have to be in a container if they are tied in secure bundles with jute or hemp (no nylon). These bundles cannot be longer than 90cm (36in), wider than 60cm (24in) in diameter and weigh more than 22kg (49pounds). Individual branch diameter cannot exceed 7.6cm (3in) because these can jam the packing mechanism in the truck.

YES these materials are acceptable

- Grass clippings
- Leaves
- Flowers
- Plants
- Tree or hedge prunings & branches less than 3" dia

No these materials are not acceptable

- Sod or Soil
- Animal feces
- Stumps
- Rocks and Gravel
- Kitchen waste
- Construction materials (ie all types of dimensional lumber)
